





Interviews with Past ProjectsPreliminary Themes & Outcomes



- 17 projects were funded through the investment
- Projects were funded for 3 to 7 years
- Variety of activities (artsbased, physical activity, parenting, youth programming, assessment)
- 3 projects continued with funding in this investment






Some projects ended at the same time as funding

 Approximately 1/3 of the projects did not continue with programming

"We have not continued our program. We have the curriculum. It's a developed curriculum. If we had the resources and interest, we would be able to implement it. But we haven't actually maintained it."





Many projects continued in some form

- Institutional uptake
- Research funding
- Foundation support
- "It's not just that there are now individuals with this knowledge, and this like, toolbox of activities related to teaching and, understanding, you know, as a concept, but it's filtered through the system into contracting, into, service provision, into all of these different elements now within our government, which is exciting."





COVID was a significant factor in sustainability planning and efforts

- Some programming stopped entirely
- Some shifted to online (and therefore now has a permanent virtual presence)






Leadership and Researcher buy-in was a factor

"Ultimately, [sustainability] came down to who the executive director was because [the committed one] was very supportive. And she was really good at looking for alternative sources of funding so post-project that last year, she found a grant, we got a grant from our local community foundation.


So honestly, I feel the program could have continued if there had been interest in continuing the program. But as I said, the last executive director was hired to shut everything down."





Relationships and connections made a difference

"The real truth of it all is that that is our strength. Like, we're very connected. We're a small population. We know who the players are. My health minister lives down the street from me, and the finance minister lives over there, like, you know what I mean? Like at the end of the day, we're able to build on those relationships."





